

Origami Dahlia

Materials:

- 6 sheets of origami paper
 Tip: You can also recycle and use colourful magazines, catalogues or used gifts! Just cut them into squares.
- Double-sided tape

Did you know?

Dahlias belong to the Asteraceae family, and are native to Mexico, South America and Colombia.

Apart from having beautiful flowers, dahlias are also edible! Marketed as "dahlia yams", they have a range of flavours and textures, though not all dahlia tubers are palatable.



Origami Dahlia

Step 1

Fold the paper in half on each diagonal axis. Crease well and unfold.






Origami Dahlia

Step 2

Fold both tips to the centre.






Origami Dahlia

Step 3

Fold both the top and bottom halves to the centre again.






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Step 4

Flip the paper over and fold in half.




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Step 5

Fold the paper in half and stick the sides together with double-sided tape.






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Step 6

Repeat steps 1 to 5 until you have 6 pieces, and stick all 6 pieces together to create a Dahlia.





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Use it as a wall decor or simply plant it as a garden decor.
