

## Origami Rhododendron

Materials:

- 5 sheets of origami paper Tip: You can also recycle and use colourful magazines, catalogues or used gift wraps! Just cut them into squares.
- Double-sided tape

### Did you know?

The rhododendron derives its name from the Greek words for 'rose' and 'tree'. These mostly evergreen plants are cultivated mainly for landscaping purposes as they have ornamental leaves and fragrant flowers that come in attractive colours.

Rhododendrons vary greatly in height. They range from woody shrubs as short as 40cm to trees as tall as 30m!






# Origami Rhododendron

### Step 1

Fold the paper in half to form a triangle.






# Origami Rhododendron

### Step 2

Fold the two bottom tips upwards.







## Origami Rhododendron

#### Step 3

Open the folds on both sides and flatten accordingly.








# Origami Rhododendron

#### Step 4

Fold the two tips downwards.






## Origami Rhododendron

#### Step 5

Fold the two flaps inwards, along the lines.






# Origami Rhododendron

#### Step 6

Apply double-sided tape on the side as shown, and fold paper in half to join the two ends.






# Origami Rhododendron

### Step 7

Repeat steps 1 to 6 four times until you have 5 individual pieces. Apply double-sided tape on all 5 pieces and join them together to form a rhododendron.
